## 2010 TANF SUMMER PROGRAM

TANF Summer Employment Program eligibility requirements include:

- Household receives TANF
- Household receives Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Youth receives Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)
- Youth receives Medicaid
- Household receives subsidized child care through the Child Care Development Fund
- Household is eligible for or receives subsidized public housing assistance
- Household participates in WIC
- Youth receives free or reduced school lunch
- Parent participates in Workforce Investment Act (WIA) adult services
- Youth eligible for, or enrolled in, WIA services
- Family income is 200 percent or below the U.S. Health and Human Services' Poverty Guidelines or the U.S. Department of Labor's Lower Living Standard Income Levels (see table below).
